## Skiing Assessment: What Level Are You Now?

\_\_\_\_\_ 1st Time – Never been skiing before

\_\_\_\_\_ Beginner – Working on turns

- Riding rope tow/magic carpet
- Easiest terrain
- Slight direction changes
- Can stop on own
- Can get up on own

\_\_\_\_\_ Novice – Confident Wedge Turns

- Wedge turns on Green Runs
- Can control speed through round turn shape, NO STRAIGHT DOWN THE HILL WEDGE!!!
- Can ride chair lift confidently

\_\_\_\_\_ Intermediate – Skidded Parallel Turns

- Can sideslip with skis parallel
- Can hockey stop
- Skiing moderate Blue Runs

\_\_\_\_\_ Advanced – Carved Parallel Turns

- Using turn shape to control speed on Black Runs
- Skiing moguls, powder, jumps

## Snowboarding Assessment: What Level Are You Now?

\_\_\_\_\_ 1st Time – Never ridden before

\_\_\_\_\_ Beginner – Basic Floating Leaf

- Can straight run and stop on one side (Toe or Heelside)
- Floating Leaf on one side only
- Can use Rope Tow, easy chairlift
- Can safely put on own board
- Riding Green Runs

\_\_\_\_\_ Novice – Basic Linked Turns

- Can make round turns on Toe and Heelside
- Can use board to ollie
- Riding harder Green Runs, Easy Blue

\_\_\_\_\_ Intermediate – Confident Linked Turns

- Riding groomed Blue Runs
- Can maintain turn shape on ice
- Experimenting with small jumps

\_\_\_\_\_ Advanced – Carved Turns/Freestyle

- Riding Black Runs in most conditions
- Progressing on jumps/rails/pipe
